# Second Saturday Bird Walks for Families and Beginners, 9:00—11:00 a.m. (FREE)



NOW thru March 2011 Sepulveda Basin Wildlife Reserve

San Fernando Valley Audubon will lead **FREE**, second **Saturday of the month**, bird walks for families and beginners, **Now thru March 2011**. (Saturdays, Nov. 13, Dec. 11, Jan. 8, Feb. 12 and Mar. 12.)

Stroll through the lovely Sepulveda Basin Wildlife Reserve, enjoying its trails and lake. Many birds come here in winter. Learn about the birds and why they come here.

#### These walks are designed for

- People trying their first bird walk
- Beginning birdwatchers
- Families with school-age children

**Time and Meeting Place**: The Wildlife Area entrance and amphitheater are in the southeast part of Woodley Park. Meet at the amphitheater at 9:00 a.m. sharp.

**Directions:** Turn north from Burbank Blvd. onto Woodley Ave., which is one-half mile west of the San Diego Freeway (I-405). Travel about one-half mile to the second possible right turn and turn east (right) at the sign for the Wildlife Reserve. Bear right at the fork in the road and go east one-half mile to the Wildlife Area parking. Walk south past the monumental rocks and restroom building to the amphitheater.

**Equipment and Clothing:** Wear sturdy shoes and layered clothing. A cap or hat with a brim is suggested. We have binoculars to loan or you can use your own.



## **Generous Donation Funds Educational Booklet for Students**



Every year San Fernando Valley Audubon brings about 2,000 students from the Los Angeles Unified School District on educational field trips to the Sepulveda Basin Wildlife Reserve. These students view and learn about the many species of birds that utilize the reserve, and their habitats. After the field trip each child is given a booklet entitled "Birds of the Sepulveda Basin." The booklet features pictures of the common birds and includes facts about their natural history. Funding, in prior years, for this gift to the students has come from a special \$5,000 grant.

When Dave Weeshoff, our new chapter president, heard that supplies of the booklet were running low and that our previous grant was no longer available, he came up with a very generous offer. Dave administers a foundation in the name of his late wife, Lin Weeshoff, who was an elementary school teacher. He felt that a donation for the new printing of "Birds of the Sepulveda Basin" from her foundation would fit the spirit of her legacy.

"Lin was very passionate in her love of nature and the education of children, and felt that we owe it to our children to open their eyes to the natural world. I'm only too happy to support this important program of the San Fernando Valley Audubon Society," Dave said.  $\psi$ 

# Monthly Field Trip Reports by Richard Barth

On September 18 we visited Huntington Central Park and the Bolsa Chica Ecological Reserve, two outstanding birding spots in Orange County.

At Huntington Central we were treated to good looks at a vagrant Prairie Warbler (!) which had been recently discovered in the park. Another previously-reported rarity, Rose-breasted Grosbeak, was briefly seen by some. Willow Flycatcher and an early Ruby-crowned Kinglet were notable sightings. Other species of interest for our list included Great Horned Owl, Lesser Yellowlegs, Greater Yellowlegs, Green Heron, Western Wood-Pewee, Pacific-slope Flycatcher, Western Kingbird, Hutton's Vireo, Warbling Vireo, House Wren, Western Tanager, Yellow Warbler, Townsend's Warbler, Wilson's Warbler and Orange-crowned Warbler.



Reddish Egret is considered rare in L.A. and Orange Counties, but in recent years has become a regular post-breeding dispersant to Bolsa Chica (from Baja?)...four had been reported in the reserve this fall and we saw three of them on this visit. Also on hand were the usual good numbers of shorebirds, gulls and terns as well as the expected herons. Red Knot, Long-billed Curlew and Snowy Plover were among the sightings of note. Still thriving in the pickleweed habitat here is "Belding's" Savannah Sparrow. The most conspicuous raptor for us was Osprey. We saw one White-faced Ibis. \psi



# **Prop 21: A LEGACY FOR CALIFORNIA STATE PARKS**

Did you know that 52 Audubon California Important Bird Areas are at least partially owned by California State Parks, totaling 156,000 acres?

Audubon California, The Nature Conservancy, Save the Redwood League and California State Parks Foundation are sponsors of The State Parks & Wildlife Conservation Trust Fund Act ("State Parks Initiative") appearing on the November 2, 2010 statewide ballot as Proposition 21.

Prop 21 works like this-

Vehicles registered in California will get a free, year round day use admission to all California state parks in exchange for a new annual \$18 vehicle license fee, a considerable savings if you go to more than two State parks in a year.

The funding will provide a stable, reliable and adequate source of funding for the state park system, for wildlife conservation and for increased and equitable access to those resources for all Californians.

The parks budget will no longer be subject to cuts by the legislature or the Governor, the Trust Fund cannot be borrowed from or raided, and our state Parks can begin work on acquisitions and deferred maintenance once the funds become available.

The passage of this proposition is a conservation legacy that all of us Audubon members in California can leave to future generations!  $\forall$
